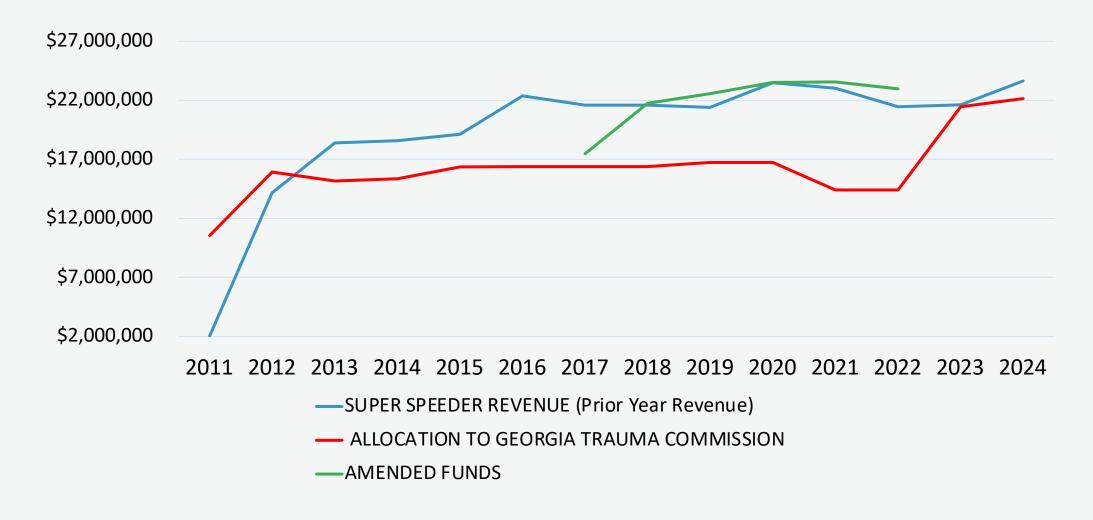

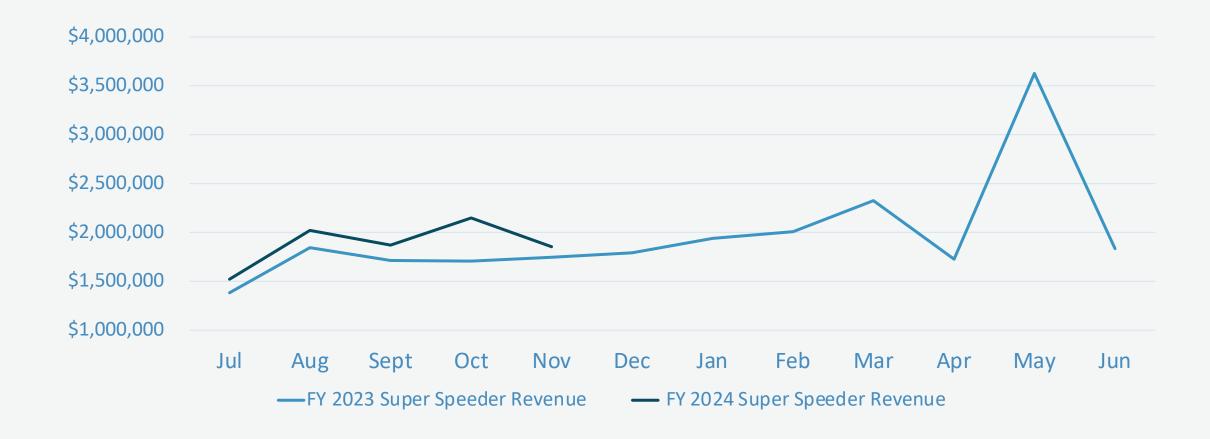

## **Notice of Grant Awards for Registry Start-Up Grants**

The Georgia Trauma Care Network Commission (GTCNC) would like to announce the recent approval of a one-time funding allocation from the Fiscal Year 2024 funds to centers not currently participating in annual contracting with GTCNC. The decision to provide a registry funding mechanism recognizes each potential trauma center's critical role in its community. This one-time funding allocation will be handled as a grant from GTCNC directly to the potential trauma center receiving the funds. Grant award amounts are based on the current cost of the ESO Registry for your facility. Requirements include the purchase of ESO V5 Web-Hosted Registry and deliverables stated in Attachment C.

**Grant Terms:** Three years or terminated upon achieving trauma center designation **or** failure to meet prior year deliverables. The Commission's source of funds to make payments pursuant to this Agreement is based upon appropriations from the General Assembly. If the source of payment for the services no longer exists or is insufficient for the Commission to meet its obligations hereunder, then the Commission may immediately terminate or put forth an amendment to this Agreement without further obligation of the Commission or the State of Georgia. The certification of the Executive Director of the Commission as to the events stated herein shall be conclusive.

NAME OF POTENTIAL TRAUMA CENTER is eligible to receive a maximum of AMOUNT for ESO Registry.
