Licensed and In-Service Ambulance Cut Off Dates



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Background

- Prior to the equipment grant process, GTC reaches out to the regional directors to verify counts for 911 ambulances for each agency within the region.
- GTC request counts from the Office of EMS and Trauma.
- GTC reconciles the counts and determine if there are any variances. Variances are sent to the Office of EMS and Trauma to determine the cause for the differences.

Background

- The main cause of the variances are due to in service dates of ambulances.

- Agencies have ambulances coming into service between the time we request the count and the time we send out the grant application.
