Subject: First Responder Grant Opportunities

In April 2012, the Georgia Association of EMS received a grant from the Georgia Trauma Care Network Commission to help improve the care of trauma victims in Georgia. This grant included monies for First Responder Training (\$112,143.70). With this grant funding the GAEMS will provide funding to teach nineteen (19) First Responders Courses.

All 911 zoned EMS providers in Georgia are eligible to apply for this grant. Please take a few minutes to read this entire document to insure your success in this opportunity.

Eligibility for this funding requires applications to be completed and mailed to GAEMS at the address listed above. Applications must be post marked on or before September 15, 2012.

The First Responder Grant – total amount to be expended - \$112,143.70

This is a competitive grant and will be awarded to the 911 zoned services that score highest on the grant scoring instrument. Only 911 zoned ambulance services will be eligible for the grant. The service may work with another agency to conduct the course but the GAEMS will deal only with the Ambulance Service and the Director of the Service will be the person accountable as it pertains to the grant. If a county does not have an ambulance service in the county then the ambulance service that provides EMS coverage will be the agency eligible for the grant. However the class should be taught in the county listed on the application. No individual county or zone will be eligible for more than one grant unless there are fewer requests than courses available. In the event of a tie we will add one point to the application whose base location is more distant to a level one or two trauma center from the EMS primary base station.

The total dollar of each grant will vary depending on the number of students who are enrolled in the first responder class. The minimum number of students eligible for this grant is 12 and the maximum number we will reimburse for is 25. While you may elect to have more than 25 students in the class we will only reimburse for a maximum of 25. Each class must go through the approval process as developed by the State Office of EMS and Trauma. To receive funding we must have a letter from the Regional Coordinator stating that your class is an approved class.

While these students may be eligible to challenge the National Registry exam, the grant funding cannot be used to pay the expenses associated with taking this exam

You are not required to have prior course approval to apply for this grant. If you are awarded the grant you will have time to meet all requirements. However if you do not have course approval by February 1, 2013, the GAEMS will revoke the grant and award to another agency. In order to be eligible for maximum funding you must complete your course and provide appropriate documentation to the GAEMS by June 30, 2013.

Upon verification of course approval from the Regional Office and a copy of the beginning roster the GAEMS will pay:

- Approved cost of the textbooks (\$70.00) per student minus any sales tax to the sponsoring agency.
- 50% of the instructor and supply fee (one half of \$25.00 per hour for 50 hours and \$10.00 per student for the supply fee. The remaining cost for the instructor will be paid when GAEMS receives confirmation from the Regional EMS Office that the course has been completed and we have received the end of course roster. GAEMS will only send two checks to the service to pay for this course.
- The GAEMS will provide a jump bag for each successful student after confirmation is received from the Regional Office at the end of the course
- GAEMS will provide a safety vest for each student who successfully completes the course. These vests will be provided after verification has been received through the Regional EMS Office of successful completion of the course, and we have received a copy of the roster of successful students with sizes needed for each student.

Subject: Grant Opportunities

The Georgia Trauma Care Network Commission has awarded the EMS community a grant to be used to purchase trauma related equipment for 911 zoned ambulance providers. The total amount of this money is \$388,641.20. In addition the GAEMS has surplus funds from the FY2011 grant that were not claimed by the EMS agencies that had previously been awarded these funds. The surplus amount is \$49,005.22. The Trauma Commission has given GAEMS permission to add these surplus funds to the FY2012 trauma equipment grant. The total amount of money to be dispersed is \$437,646.42.

Additionally, this year the Trauma Commission has agreed to allow the service to purchase any equipment that will enhance your ability to care for trauma patients.

All 911 zoned EMS providers in Georgia are eligible to apply for this grant. Please take a few minutes to read this entire document to insure your success in these opportunities.

Eligibility for this funding requires applications to be completed and mailed to GAEMS at the address listed above and be post marked on or before September 15, 2012, or you may send your application electronically to Kim Littleton, Executive Director of GAEMS, at kimberly0630@gmail.com.

The Equipment Grant – total amount to be expended \$437,646.42

This grant will be awarded in an equal amount for each licensed ambulance used to provide emergency patient care as part of a 911 zone. This is a non-competitive grant. Each eligible ambulance will receive the same dollar amount in this grant. The exact amount of money to be allocated to each 911 zoned ambulance will be determined after the grant application deadline of September 1, 2012. The amount awarded per each ambulance will be determined by dividing the total grant amount by the number of 911 zoned ambulances that we have received applications for by the grant application deadline of September 15, 2012.

While every 911 ambulance is eligible for the funding *you must apply for these funds to be* awarded the money. GAEMS will send only one check to your service to reimburse for the grant.
